The Texas Education Scorecard provides grades based on how successfully children are moving through the “education pipeline” in their area. We provide data and grades for 252 counties in Texas. Two counties, Loving and Kenedy, were not graded because of insufficient data. There are no schools in Loving County. Kenedy County has no secondary schools and a single elementary school.
